Surface Decorative Techniques

Instructor: Rachel Dove Studio 5

Learn how to create and explore various surface design techniques to decorate your ceramic work. Students will decorate four plates using the techniques of Sgraffito, Paper Stencil, Wax Resist, Glazed Inlay, and Tape Resist methods. During class, we will explore creating dynamic motifs using underglaze slips and glazes at both the green and bisque ware stages. We will spend some time at the beginning of class brainstorming, sketching ideas, and focusing our designs on a unified theme. For the surface design techniques, no drawing experience

is necessary. Students may bring a sketchbook or paper, a pencil, and inspirational resource images to develop designs. Remember that clay can be messy; bring an apron and/or wear clothing and shoes that you don't mind getting clay on or possibly wet.

The workshop fee includes the cost of all materials plus firing fees



Forged with Fire

Instructor: Dana Copper Studio 1

This class explores the traditional tools and techniques of the Coppersmith. How to use a hammer, steel block or anvil, and a torch. We explore fusing sterling silver onto copper to create a lunar-textured surface. Create one of a kind hand-hammered copper creation! Students can add stones and patina to their lunar pendants for color and texture.



Wheel Thrown Ceramics

Instructor: Justin Wheel Studio 6

In this course, we will learn techniques and tips to help students of any age center and throw straighter vessels.

Each student is required to bring their own basic pottery kit.



Storyboard and Thumbnail Concepts

Instructor: Jay Stuart Studio 9

In this workshop, you will be shown the process, technique, and advantages of this simple and exciting step in making the final version of your envisioned art. It's all about doing quick but definable thumbnails of your intent of the project and then trying different angles, colors, and designs in different studies to see which one is best suited for your final idea. It can be used for your paintings, illustrations, and sequential art!

Required material: Sketchbook (9x12).



Individualized Still Life with Colored Pencils

Instructor: Margaret Minardi Studio 7

Students will each create a personal still life using small objects. You can bring unusual objects from home or objects will be made available for you to draw. Some examples you might bring include any type of art supply including paint tubes, paint brushes and crayons. You might also have available a unique figurine or a small plant. Objects should be interesting to you personally and preferably have some color on them.

Margaret Minardi will present different techniques in the use of colored pencils. We will explore advanced methods such as burnishing and working with the grain of the page. Please bring a box of Prismacolor Colored Pencils if you have them The larger the size set, the better. Everyone will leave with a portfolio of quality works of art.



Gelli Plate Workshop

Instructor: Chris Ann Ambery Gallery

Join us for an exciting workshop that will explore the many techniques of Gelli Plate Printing. Gelli Plate Printing is a wonderfully expressive and versatile hand printing technique that is done without a press. Prints can be created on a variety of papers and fabrics with acrylic paint or printing inks. This form of printmaking is suitable for all ages and levels of expertise.

During this workshop participants will create single-layer and multi-layer monotypes. Participants will use stencils, household items, and foliage to create beautiful textures and explore color to create opaque and transparent layers. All you need to bring is your enthusiasm and creative spirit.



Monotype Printmaking

Instructor: Stephanie Jacobson Studio 2

Monotype is a printmaking technique where you use a plastic plexi-glass plate as your substrate, and you paint on it. Using an etching press, the image on the plexi-glass transfers to the printmaking paper when you roll it through the press. There are many ways to approach monotype. Your image can be realistic or abstract or non-objective. You may prepare an image in advance, or you can be spontaneous. See colors mix when you work with multiple plates and print in layers. Bring your imagination and a willingness to experiment. No prior experience necessary- Everyone can make successful prints!
